- New lighting on the walking paths, replacing original lighting as they break with Eco lighting.
- A facelift for the pool.
- Making our ball field a real ball field by grading and adding the necessary surface materials.
- Reviving the sand volleyball area since it is now a giant weed patch and the sand is like concrete. It needs tilling and sand added (already started).
- The children's area needs updating and maybe some additional play items. Some of this is already started.
- The interior of Town Hall needs a complete makeover including the exercise room.
- A much bigger storage shed for the pool pump, furniture, tools, seasonal decorations, etc. This will save the Village money by eliminating storage fees.
- The exterior of the Town Hall needs ongoing repairs and replacement. The steps were recently replaced with 40-year wood.

The gazebo benches were just rebuilt with #1 grade pressure-treated lumber. The wood that was replaced was all rotten and held together with paint. This was accomplished by using volunteer labor and an excellent job was done.

To be on the safe side, ask to see their permit before making a purchase. Solicitors are required to register with the Township at which point they must fill out the proper paperwork and pay the fee. The Pool Committee is excited that summer is here once again. Have you been to the pool lately? If not, come on out and enjoy our little oasis in the village!

There are plenty of loungers, tables and chairs for you to relax. We are in need of more umbrellas and we are going to be ordering 5 more. These will crank up and down and tilt, unlike the current umbrellas we have.

The pool is also sporting some new signs. We have added two (2) "No Diving" signs and a sign on the gate giving the pool hours and stating that the pool is for "VOG Residents Only." It is important for all residents to remember their keys and green tags when going to the pool. We have other communities around us that do not have the amenities we do and they should not have

access to our pool. It is equally important for homeowners visiting the pool NOT to allow access to others who do not have their keys. This will pave the way for everyone to remember their keys.

A few things the Pool Committee would like to highlight:

- The lost and found bags are located in the pool area by the gate.
- There is some yellow staining on the bottom of the pool. This is from the ground water that flows through a valve that is part of the pool system. The stain will not hurt anyone or anything and we are hopeful that the chemicals used during the year will eliminate it.
- The pool gate has been repaired so it should close easily after leaving the pool area, but make sure it does latch when you enter or exit the pool area.
- Please be sure to towel dry off before entering Town Hall. We have new mats on the floor this year, but the floor still gets slick when wet.
- Turn off the lights in the bathrooms and Town Hall.
- No diving into the pool.
- Drop any aluminum cans into the plastic trash can under the stairs near the door to the lower level of Town Hall. These will be recycled.

The mission of the Pool Committee is to help keep our residents safe while having fun at the pool.

Design Review/Preservation Committee:

INFO ABOUT CLOTHES DRYERS...

Keeping the lint filter clean after every load is important. And after you remove the lint, it may look

clean. But you need to take it one step further. Take the filter to the sink and run hot water over it. The lint filter is made of a mesh material. If the hot water just sits on top of the mesh, it needs to be cleaned with hot, soapy water and toothbrush or other brush. The dryer sheets you use cause a film to form over the mesh (oil-based fragrance and static control) that can burn out the heating unit in time. You can't SEE the film, but it's there. If not cleaned at least every six (6) months, the residue on the filter can build up and catch fire. Taking this extra step can prolong the life of your dryer and save you a few pennies on your electric bill! And if you haven't had your dryer vents cleaned recently, you may want to contact a professional and have them checked. They will be able to tell you if they need to be cleaned and will recommend how often it should be done.

homes, including cats, but they need to be on a leash if outside and not left alone to bark. We also have a pooper scooper rule that you must pick up your animal droppings and dispose of them in a closed container...*not the storm sewers*. Thank you for obeying these rules!

Green Recreation Permit Tags

When you became a resident of Village on the Green, you received a green recreation permit tag with a number on it that identifies you as a resident. These are NOT to be shared with guests or friends outside of the Village. You should bring these tags with you when using the amenities in the Village—i.e., pool, tennis court, fishing, volleyball and any VOG social gathering. If you have misplaced or lost your tag, contact Towne Properties (489-4059) for a new one. The cost to replace a lost tag is \$25.00.

Crystal Lake

Our lake is there for your use, but you need to remember that this is a *catch and release* lake, with the exception of bluegills. You must also carry your green recreation permit tag with you. You may ask anybody to show you theirs if you don't know them. Guests are permitted to fish at our lake as long as you are present and have your green tag. Children under 14 years of age are not permitted to fish without an adult present. If you run across someone who does not have a green tag, you should ask them to leave or call Hamilton Township Policy at 925-2525. As more new developments surround us, we need to keep a close eye on who uses our amenities.
